The Georgia Tech Career Survey is designed to capture students’ post-graduation plans, particularly with regard to employment and further education. The survey is administered to graduating students at the end of each semester. Data from the survey instrument is used to generate the Salary Report, which provides a summary of employment offers, acceptances, salary offers and signing bonuses presented by major, college, and degree level. It is important to note that the results presented are based on self-reported information. In some instances, reported salaries may vary considerably from year to year. Actual salaries can vary based on prior work experience, specific desired skills, job location, and other factors.


